

the several sums received and expended, and from whom received and for what account, and for what particular purposes expended and to whom paid, and the mayor and common council shall require the said treasurer to enter into bond, with sufficient security for the true and faithful performance of his duties as such, which bond shall be liable as collectors' bonds are, under the laws of the State.

Powers of a justice.

SEC. 28. *And be it enacted*, That the mayor of the town of Union Bridge, by virtue of his office, for municipal purposes and preserving the peace, shall have all the powers of a justice of the peace.

Disqualification.

SEC. 29 *And be it enacted*, That no justice of the peace shall be eligible to any office of said town, either by election or appointment; if he shall be appointed a justice of the peace or qualifies as such, he shall then cease to hold office as aforesaid.

Effective.

SEC 30. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the first day of June next ensuing its passage.

CHAPTER 435.

AN ACT to repeal sections sixty five to ninety inclusive, article eight of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Cecil county," sub-title "Elkton," as amended by the act of eighteen hundred and seventy-two, chapter three hundred and seventy, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Repealed and re-enacted.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That sections sixty-five to ninety inclusive, of article eight of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Cecil county," sub-title "Elkton," as amended by the act of eighteen hundred and sev-
