

resides within the limits of the said new district, shall continue to exercise all the functions of his office until his successor is duly appointed and qualified according to law.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That at the January session of the General Assembly of Maryland, in the year eighteen hundred and eighty-two, and thence on, as now provided by law, the Governor of Maryland shall appoint a registrar of voters and two justices of the peace for said new district; and at their usual time for appointing constables, and as now provided by law, the County Commissioners of Dorchester county shall, in the year eighteen hundred and eighty, and thence on, appoint two constables for said new district, and a collector for the same shall be appointed as soon as may be convenient after the passage of this act, as provided by the local law of Dorchester county; and the county commissioners of said county shall cause the assessable property of the said districts numbers two, three, eleven and seven, embraced within the limits of the said new district, to be transferred to the latter; and provided that the vacancy in the number of justices of the peace in district number seven, or Cambridge district, caused by the transfer of one of their number to Linkwood district, shall not hereafter be filled, but the number of justices in Cambridge shall hereafter be three, and not four, as heretofore provided.

Appoint constable.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the day of its passage.
