

appointed, and such notice shall be filed in the clerk's office where the commission and oath or affirmation of such policeman shall have been recorded, which notice shall be noted by such clerk upon the margin of the record where such commission and oath or affirmation are recorded, and thereupon the power of such policeman shall cease and be determined.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.

CHAPTER 461.

AN ACT to repeal section six hundred and twenty-eight A of the Code of Public Local Laws, article four, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Justices of the Peace and Constables," as introduced by an act passed at the session of eighteen hundred and seventy-six, chapter twenty-eight, and entitled "An act to repeal sections six hundred and nineteen, six hundred and twenty, six hundred and twenty-five, six hundred and twenty-six, six hundred and twenty-seven and six hundred and twenty-eight of article four of the Public Local Laws," title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Justices of the Peace and Constables," and to enact certain sections in lieu of the sections so repealed, and to re-enact said section with an amendment.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That section six hundred and twenty-eight A of the Code of Public Local Laws, article four, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Justices Repealed and re-enacted.
