

CHAPTER 464.

AN ACT to repeal section one of chapter fifty-seven of the acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-six, relating to the protection of partridges in certain counties, so far only as the same relates to Queen Anne's county, and re-enact the same so far only as said county is concerned.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That section one of chapter fifty-seven of the acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-six, relating to the protection of partridges, be and the same is hereby repealed so far as the same relates to Queen Anne's county, and re-enacted so as to read as follows :

Repealed and re-enacted.

SEC. 2. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That it shall not be lawful to shoot or trap any partridges or rabbits in Queen Anne's county, from the thirty-first day of December to the twentieth day of October in any year, and woodcock from the thirty-first day of December to the fifteenth day of June in each and every year.

When unlawful to shoot, &c.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
