CHAPTER 478.

AN ACT to repeal, amend and re-enact section twelve of chapter two hundred and twenty of the Acts of the General Assembly, passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-two, to revive the act of incorporation of the town of Salisbury.

Repealed and re-enacted.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section twelve of chapter two hundred and twenty of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-two, to revive the act of incorporation of the town of Salisbury, be and the same is hereby repealed, amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Not permitted to run at large. SEC. 12. And be it enacted, That no horse, cattle, hog or other live stock, geese, chicken or other domestic fowl, shall be permitted to run at large within the limits of the said town; and if any chicken or other domestic fowl (except geese) shall trespass upon any street, alley, garden or other lot of ground in said town, in violation of the provisions of this section, any person seeing the same so trespassing may immediately catch or take, or cause the same to be caught or taken, and placed in the custody of the bailiff of the town, who shall immediately proceed to give at least three days' notice of the said catching or taking, by advertisement posted at the court house door in said town, and after giving said notice the said bailiff shall proceed to sell to the highest bidder, for cash, each and every chicken or other domestic fowl so caught and taken (geese ex-
