CHAPTER 63.

AN ACT to punish the sale or other disposition of intoxicating liquors on or near the graded road leading from the Western Maryland railroad to High Rock, in Washington county.

WHEREAS it is represented to the General Assembly of Maryland that places of public resort, known as Penmar Park and High Rock, have been established in Washington county, near Penmar station, on the Western Maryland railroad, and that great numbers of persons from this and other States resort thither for pleasure and recreation, including many women and children; now, therefore,

Picamble.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall not be lawful for the keeper of any hotel, tavern, store, drinking establishment or any other place where liquors are sold directly or indirectly, to sell, barter or give, or dispose of any spirituous or fermented liquors, ale or beer, or intoxicating drinks of any kind upon the graded road leading from the Western Maryland railroad to High Rock, or at any place in this State within one-quarter of a mile from any part of said graded road between said railroad and High Rock. or within one-quarter of a mile of any buildings at High Rock or at Penmar station, or to place or distribute any signs, cards or other devices inviting to the purchase of such liquors, ale, beer or intoxicating drinks, or to solicit the purchase of the same within the limits of the one-quarter of a mile aforesaid.

Unlawful to sell.

Sec. 2. Any persons violating the provisions of the preceding section shall be liable to indictment by the Grand Jury of Washington county, and shall, upon conviction before the Circuit Court for Washington county, be fined not less than fifty dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each and every offence; one-half of the fine shall be paid to the informer, and the other to the County Commissioners of Washington county, for the use of the public roads.
