

Roads. consideration of said transfer all the property within the corporate limits of said city shall hereafter be exempt from taxation for public, district or county road purposes outside of said corporate limits; but nothing in this section contained shall be construed as preventing or prohibiting the said county commissioners of Harford county from making appropriations out of the general levy of the county for the use of the corporation of Havre-de-Grace or from levying for the same.

Liquor License. 192. No license to sell spirituous or fermented liquors in said city shall be granted to any applicant who has complied with the three preceding sections until said applicant shall have paid to the clerk of the circuit court for Harford county the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars, and the further sum of five dollars for approving and filing the said bond and other papers and for his other costs and charges in issuing the said license, which said sum of three hundred and fifty dollars the said clerk shall pay over to the mayor and city council of Havre-de-Grace within thirty days after it has been received by him, without any abatement or deduction whatever, and the said mayor and city council shall apply all such sums so received by them after the year eighteen hundred and ninety-one; first, to the payment of the interest on the bonded indebtedness of said city, and whatever surplus remains after the payment of said interest shall be paid over to and become a part of the sinking funds of said city to pay the principal of said bonds at their maturity.

Effective. SEC. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 181.

AN ACT to incorporate the trustees of the Maryland annual conference of the methodist protestant church.

Preamble. WHEREAS, it has been represented that the ministers and lay delegates comprising the Maryland annual conference of the methodist protestant church may from time to time receive by gifts, devises, bequests, grants and otherwise, money, lands or other property, and become possessed of the same for religious and benevolent purposes, and they are desirous that a corporate body be created for the more successful holding, management and disposition of any property thus or in any other way acquired; therefore,
