

SEC. 204 A. In all cases of the sale of real estate by the collectors of State and county taxes for non-payment of said taxes, there shall be allowed to the said collector from the proceeds of sale of such real estate, in addition to the fees and expenses now allowed by law, a reasonable sum for his counsel fees not to exceed the sum of ten dollars for reporting said sale to and procuring the ratification thereof by the circuit court for said county.

CHAPTER 25.

AN ACT to repeal section twenty-eight, of Article twelve, of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, entitled "Garrett county," sub-title "Circuit Court," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That section twenty-eight, of Article twelve, of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, entitled "Garrett county," sub-title "Circuit Court," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

SEC. 28. There shall be two jury and two non-jury regular common law terms of the Circuit Court for Garrett county to be held at Oakland; the two jury terms shall commence on the third Monday of March and the second Monday of September in each year, and the two non-jury terms shall commence on the first Monday of July and the third Monday of December in each year, and to the said jury terms jurors shall be summoned and returned in the mode prescribed by law.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from and after the first day of June in the year eighteen hundred and ninety.

CHAPTER 26.

AN ACT to provide for the destruction of fruit trees in Washington county infected with the disease known as the "Yellows."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That it shall be unlawful for any person to keep in Washington county any peach, almond, apricot or nectarine tree, infected with
