

CHAPTER 212.

AN ACT to refund to Daniel Laffy moneys erroneously paid into the treasury.

Freamble. WHEREAS, on the twenty-eighth day of April, eighteen hundred and eighty-eight, an oyster house license for twelve months was inadvertently and unlawfully issued by the clerk of the circuit court for Baltimore county to one Daniel Laffy, he paying therefor the sum of fifty dollars, which amount, less five per centum, was paid into the treasury by the said clerk in his June report of that year; and

Preamble. WHEREAS, said license being issued contrary to the act of eighteen hundred and eighty-eight, chapter three hundred and seven, which prohibits the clerk of the circuit court for Baltimore county from granting a license to any one to sell spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer at Messrs. Brigham Hopkins and company's hat factory, or at any place within one mile thereof, was therefore revoked by the court on the twenty-fifth day of June, eighteen hundred and eighty-eight; now therefore

To re-pay. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the comptroller of the treasury is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the treasurer in favor of Daniel Laffy for forty-seven dollars and fifty cents out of any moneys not otherwise appropriated.

Effective. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 213.

AN ACT to refund to Thomas W. Treakle, late collector of State taxes for the third collection district of Howard county, certain moneys erroneously paid by him into the treasury.

To re-pay. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the comptroller of the treasury be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant upon the treasurer in favor of Thomas W. Treakle, late collector of State taxes for the third collection district of Howard county, for the sum of eleven dollars and fifteen cents, being the amount overpaid by him into the treasury, the refunding thereof having received the recommendation of the treasury officials.

Effective. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
