

CHAPTER 214.

AN ACT to prevent persons from unlawfully using or wearing the insignia or rosette of the military order of the loyal legion of the United States, or the badge or button of the grand army of the republic.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That an additional section be added to the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Fraud," to be numbered one hundred and nineteen A, and to read as follows:

To add.

119 A. Any person who shall wilfully wear the insignia or rosette of the military order of the loyal legion of the United States, or badge or button of the grand army of the republic, or use the same to obtain aid or assistance within this State, unless he shall be entitled to use or wear the same under the constitution and by-laws, rules and regulations of such organization shall be guilty of misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars.

Misdemeanor.

CHAPTER 215.

AN ACT to refund to Everhard Hartke, late collector of State taxes for the first collection district of Howard county, certain moneys erroneously paid by him into the treasury.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the comptroller of the treasury be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant upon the treasurer in favor of Everhard Hartke, late collector of State taxes for the first collection district of Howard county, for the sum of twenty-three dollars and fifty-three cents, being the amount overpaid by him into the treasury, the refunding thereof having received the recommendation of the treasury officials.

To re-pay.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
