nished by the building committee the contract was awarded to Morrow and Owen at forty-seven thousand five hundred and sixty-Preamble. five dollars, but owing largely to labor strikes and troubles over which the contractors had no control during the time of construction, the building cost more than the contract price as shown by a statement filed with the building committee; and

WHEREAS, it appears that said annex has been well and substantially built and represents to the State the full value of all Preamble, the money expended in its construction, and it is right and proper that said claimants, who furnished labor and material, not being able to protect themselves by placing liens on the State's property, should not be prejudiced in the payment of their claims by the inability of the said contractors to pay for said building out of the contract price in accordance with their bid;

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the comptroller of the treasury be and he is hereby directed to issue his warrant on the treasurer of this State payable to the order of the said building committee for the sum of (\$12,253.41) twelve thousand two hundred and fifty-three dollars and fortyone cents, being the amount required in addition to the unexpended balance still in the hands of the said committee, to pay the claims hereinafter referred to, and that the said building committee is hereby directed to pay to the firm of Bartlett, Havward and company the sum of (\$1,500,) one thousand five hundred dollars, and to pay to G. W. Addison, gas fitting, fifty dollars; W. B.
