Buck and company, hardware, eight dollars and seventy-one cents; Bolton Brothers, paints, one hundred and eighty-one dollars and twenty-five cents; Henry Seim and company, paints, forty-two dollars and sixty-seven cents; G. E. Franklin and company, sundries, thirty dollars and forty-seven cents; John Kealy, sundries, ninety dollars and forty-nine cents; J. S. Tilbert, sundries, thirty-eight dollars and twenty-five cents; Flannary Brothers, for materials, labor and use of derrick and tools, one hundred and thirty-two dollars; said amounts being due to the said claimants for work and labor done and materials furnished in the construction of the said annex, and to be accepted by the said claimants respectively, in full of all their claims and demands for the construction of the said annex.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.

CHAPTER 228.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to defray the expenses of the commission appointed to settle the disputed questions as to the boundary line between the States of Maryland and Virginia at Hog island.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the treasurer of this State be and he is hereby directed to pay upon the warrant of the comptroller the sum of fifteen hundred dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary to the board of public works, to defray the costs and expenses of the commission appointed to settle the disputed questions as to the boundary line between this State and the State of Virginia at Hog island, the same to be paid out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.
