

in the judgment of said sheriff and the State's attorney for said county, necessary for the safe keeping of such prisoner or prisoners:

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the compensation of such warden shall not exceed the sum of one dollar per day for the time so employed, and shall be levied by the county commissioners at their annual levy of taxes for said county. Per diem

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.

### CHAPTER 286.

AN ACT to repeal section two hundred and three, of article twenty-four, of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Worcester county," sub-title "Pocomoke," and re-enact the same with amendments.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That section two hundred and three, of article twenty-four, of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Worcester county," sub-title "Pocomoke," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows: Repeal

203. The male residents of said Pocomoke city of the age of twenty-one years and upwards, being citizens of the United States, who have resided in said town for the space of six months next preceding the first Monday in June, shall elect by ballot on that day, at such place as may be designated by the town commissioners of said Pocomoke city, after notice thereof has been given by handbills, at least ten days before said day, and in every second year thereafter, accounting from the year eighteen hundred and ninety, five commissioners for said town who shall have resided within the limits of said town one year next preceding said election. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.
