CHAPTER 287.

AN ACT to enable William R. Martin to settle his account as guardian with Robert McGinn.

Preamble. WHEREAS, some doubt has arisen as to the age of Robert McGinn; and,

WHEREAS, the said Robert claims that he has reached the age Preamble of twenty-one years and ought to have the small amount in the hands of William R. Martin, his guardian, paid him; now, therefore,

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,
That William R. Martin, the guardian of Robert McGinn, be and
to settle. he is hereby authorized and empowered to settle his guardian account with said Robert McGinn, and that the said Robert McGinn
be and he is hereby authorized to execute to said William R. Martin a release which shall be as valid and binding as if said Robert
McGinn were twenty-one years of age.

Effective. Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 288.

AN ACT to repeal section one hundred and ninety-nine, of article fifteen, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Kent county," sub-title "Sheriff," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,
1 That section one hundred and ninety-nine, of article fifteen, of
the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Kent county," sub-title
"Sheriff," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, so
as to read as follows:

SEC. 199. And be it enacted, That the sheriff of Kent county

shall be entitled to receive a sum, not exceeding fifty cents a day, for boarding and keeping each prisoner committed to his custody, until the first day of December, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-one; and from and after the first day of December, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-one, the said sheriff shall be entitled to receive a sum, not exceeding thirty-five cents a day, for boarding and keeping each prisoner committed to his custody, and the said sheriff is hereby required to keep a book at the jail, which he shall procure for the purpose, in which he shall record the name of each prisoner committed to his custody, and by what authority, the tame when received, and the offense charged, and also the date of his discharge, which book shall be open to the
