

all deeds shall be in the name of the "Baltimore humane impartial society and aged women's and aged men's home," and be signed by the president of the trustees or by a majority of the trustees; the trustees shall also be entitled to the privileges of members of the society and may attend the annual meeting; they shall give advice and counsel upon such other matters as the managers may request of them from time to time.

SEC. 9. *And be it enacted,* That all property of every kind shall be held and managed in the said name of the corporation, and any property, stocks, bonds or other funds, may be put in that name upon order of said trustees.

SEC. 10. *And be it enacted,* That said corporation may take by gift, legacy, devise or otherwise, by any name designated for or intended for the said corporation, and by its old corporate names, and no misnomer shall render the same invalid; provided such design or intent appears.

SEC. 11. *And be it enacted,* That said corporation may take and hold property of all kinds in manner aforesaid, whose income shall not exceed the annual sum of one hundred thousand dollars.

SEC. 12. *And be it enacted,* That the existence of said corporation is hereby made perpetual, and this act shall take effect from its passage, subject to the right of the State of Maryland to repeal, alter or amend the same at pleasure.

CHAPTER 291.

AN ACT to fix the compensation of the sheriff of Garrett county for boarding prisoners confined in the jail of said county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the sheriff of Garrett county shall be allowed for keeping and boarding each prisoner committed to the jail of said county the sum of forty cents per day to be levied by the county commissioners at their annual levy of taxes for said county.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That all acts or parts of acts in conflict with the provisions of this act be and the same are hereby repealed so far as the same relate to Garrett county.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
