

CHAPTER 295.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments section four, of chapter four hundred and two, of the acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and eighty-two, entitled an act to revive the act incorporating certain trustees to build an academy or school house in or near the town of Manchester, in Baltimore county, to be known by the name of the "Manchester united academy or school," passed at the session of the General Assembly of Maryland, in the year eighteen hundred and twenty-eight, chapter one hundred, and re-enact the same with amendments.

SECTION 4. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That section two, of the aforesaid act and chapter, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, so as to read as follows: that the aforesaid trustees shall consist of the councilmen, together with the mayor, who shall be *ex-officio* president of the board of trustees of the town of Manchester. Repeal
and re-en-
acted.

SEC. 5. *And be it further enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.

CHAPTER 296.

AN ACT to prohibit the granting of license for the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer at Park Mills, Frederick county, Maryland, or at any place within said Frederick county, within two miles in every direction from Park Mills.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That hereafter it shall not be lawful for the clerk of the circuit court for Frederick county, to issue license to any person or persons to sell spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer at Park Mills, or at any place in Frederick county, Maryland, nearer than two miles in every direction from Park Mills, in said county. No liquor
to be sold.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the first day of May next after its passage. Effective.
