CHAPTER 303.

AN ACT to add an additional section to article twelve, of the Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Garrett county," subtitle "County Commissioners," authorizing the county commissioners to levy money to the mayor and council of Oakland, said section to follow section forty-one and to be numbered forty-one and a half.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That an additional section be added to article twelve, of the Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Garrett county," sub-title "County Commissioners," to follow section forty-one, to be num-- bered forty-one and a half and to read as follows:

SEC. 41½. They shall have power to levy annually to the mayor and council of Oakland such sum as in their judgment may be Tolevy. proper to aid the mayor and council in keeping the public roads and streets in said town in repair.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from Effectives. the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 304.

AN ACT to repeal section eighty-six, of article fifty-six, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Licenses," sub-title "Penalties," relating to the sale of liquors to minors, and to re-enact the same with amendments by substituting in lieu thereof the following sections to be designated "Section 86 A, and 86 B."

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section eighty-six, of article fifty-six, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Licenses," sub-title "Penalties," be Repeat. and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, so as to read as follows:

SEC. 86. If any person shall sell or barter any spirituous or SEC. 86. If any person snail sett of barter tary person who is a minor or under twenty-one years of age, or shall sell or barter to any per-sale to.
