under the provisions of this act, and the application of any such club or corporation for such license shall be made by the steward or any other officer of said club or corporation in substantial compliance with the provisions of section three of this act, and notice of such application shall be published as required in section five of this act, for case where such application is filed by any individual.

SEC. 20. And be it enacted, That any person, club or corporation desiring to obtain under the provisions of this act a license for twelve months on the first day of May, eighteen hundred and ninety, shall not be required to file the application therefor on or tion before the first day of April in the year eighteen hundred and ninety, as provided in section three of this act, but may file the same at any time prior to the granting of the said license, and that the clerk of the said circuit court shall grant the said license without publishing the notice required by section five of this act.

SEC. 21. And be it enacted, That all prosecutions pending at the time of the passage of this act for any violations of any of Violations the provisions of article fifty-six, of the Code of Public General Laws repealed by this act, and all violations of any of the said provisions of said article that shall have occurred before the passage of this act shall be prosecuted to conviction and punishment to the same extent as if this act had not been passed.

Effective.

SEC. 22. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 335.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to pay the claims of Messrs. Oehm and company, clothiers of Baltimore, Maryland, for uniforms furnished the Baltimore light infantry.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the comptroller of the treasury be and is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the treasurer of the State in favor of Messrs. Oehm and company of Baltimore, for the sum of one thousand five hundred and eighteen dollars and sixty-two cents (1,518.62,) being the amount due them for uniforms furnished the Baltimore light infantry; provided, that the same hereby appropriated shall be paid out of the annual appropriation for the year eighteen hundred and ninety to the militia, but not to be deducted from or considered as a part of the share of such appropriation applicable to said Baltimore light infantry.
