is hereby authorized and required to make out in a fair and legible handwriting, general indexes in the names of both plaintiffs and defendants of all judgments recovered in said court from the year eighteen hundred and seventy-seven to eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, both inclusive, and of all equity cases docketed in said court from the year eighteen hundred and fifty to eighteen Make in dexes. hundred and eighty-nine, both inclusive, and shall be allowed therefor the same compensation as is now allowed by law for making general indexes to land records of the county, in addition to all costs for index record books to be furnished by said clerk, and to be paid for by the county commissioners for Talbot county.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That the county commissioners of Talbot county be and they are hereby directed to pay to the clerk of the circuit court for Talbot county, whatever sum or sums of money may be found to be due him under the preceding section.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That from and after the passage of this act it shall be the duty of said clerk to enter in said indexes, in the name of both plaintiffs and defendants, all judgments and Duty of equity cases thereafter, and also to enter the same satisfied and ended, for which service he shall be allowed the sum of fifty cents to be paid for by the parties to the suit as other costs are now paid.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from Effective. the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 428.

AN ACT to repeal section fifty-seven, of the local laws of Wicomico county, being article twenty-three, of the Code of Public Local Laws, respecting the jurisdiction of justices of the peace in misdemeanors and felonies, and to amend and re-enact the same as amended.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section fifty-seven, of article twenty-three, of the Code of Public Local Laws, being the local laws for Wicomico county, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, so as to read as follows:

SEC. 57. The several justices of the peace of Wicomico county shall have, in addition to the jurisdiction which they now possess, and which may be conferred upon them by or under the laws of this State, jurisdiction concurrent with that exercised by the circuit court for said county in all cases of assault, without any
