CHAPTER 436.

AN ACT to refund to J. Thomas Webster and Margaret P. Chesney, administrators of William H. Chesney, deceased, late collector of State taxes in the second and sixth election districts of Harford county, the sum of one hundred and thirtyseven dollars heretofore erroneously paid by said William H. Chesnev into the treasury of the State.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland. That on the warrant of the comptroller the treasurer of the State is hereby directed to pay to J. Thomas Webster and Margaret P. Chesney, administrators of William H. Chesney, deceased, late collector of State taxes in the second and sixth election districts of Harford county, the sum of one hundred and thirty-seven dollars, being the amount due the said William H. Chesney on the books of the comptroller for over-payment into the treasury of the State, and which amount is by the said comptroller and treasurer recommended to be so paid.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from Effective. the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 437.

AN ACT entitled an act to repeal sections forty-six, sixty, sixtytwo and sixty-three, of article ten, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Dorchester county," sub-title "Cambridge," and to re-enact the same with amendments. ,

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland. That sections forty-six, sixty, sixty-two and sixty-three, of article ten. of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Dorchester county," sub-title "Cambridge," be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments so as to read as follows:

Repeal

SEC. 46. The town commissioners of Cambridge, in addition to other duties provided in this charter, shall be and constitute a board of police commissioners to serve without extra pay, and they, or a majority of them, shall appoint on or about the Police first day of October, of each and every year, not less than three sober, discreet and muscular men for policemen, whose term of service shall be six months unless sooner discharged for inefficiency or misconduct; the said police board, or a majority them, shall fill all vacancies occasioned by resignation, death, discharge or
