assembly, passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and seventy-four, entitled "an act to change the name of the south Baltimore chemical works, incorporated by chapter one hundred and eight, of the acts of the general assembly of eighteen hundred and sixty-four to that of the Chappell chemical and fertilizer company," and chapter one hundred and twenty-eight, of the acts of the general assembly, passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and eighty, entitled "an act to amend the act of eighteen hundred and sixty-four, chapter one hundred and eight, incorporating the south Baltimore chemical works, by substituting the name of Thomas C. Chappell for that of Philip S. Chappell, now deceased, as a corporator, commissioner and director thereunder."

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Chappell chemical and fertilizer company be and it is Chemical hereby authorized and empowered to erect and conduct, or to acquire and conduct, chemical works in Baltimore city, or in any one or more of the counties of this State, or in Baltimore city and any one or more of said counties.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 460.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments section two hundred and fifty-three, of article seventeen, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Prince George's county," sub-title "Liquor and Intoxicating Drinks."

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland. That section two hundred and fifty-three, of article seventeen, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Prince George's county," sub-title "Liquor and Intoxicating Drinks," be and the same is hereby repealed and thereupon re-enacted so as to read as follows:

253. No spirituous or fermented liquors or alcoholic bitters shall be sold in any election district of said county, except as provided for by section two hundred and fifty-two, and also upon the following terms: that each and every applicant, person, house, corporation, company or association, shall be recommended to the said clerk by five respectable free-holders, dwelling within a radius of one mile from the place at which such business is to be carried
