C. W. Fontaine. 28. To C. W. Fontaine, for publishing delinquents to the State in the "Somerset Herald," thirty dollars.

Easton home of the friendless. 29. To the home of the friendless in the diocese of Easton, at Easton, Maryland, the sum of five hundred dollars annually for two years.

To pay. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the treasurer of the State shall upon the warrant of the comptroller of the treasury, pay the said sums of money herein appropriated for the objects and purposes hereinbefore specified, to or upon the order of the person or persons or bodies corporate entitled to receive the same.

Effective. SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 470.

AN ACT to make punishable a minor or persons under twenty-one years of age who shall obtain from another any spirituous or fermented liquors by knowingly and wilfully misrepresenting his age.

Misdemeanor. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That any person under the age of twenty-one years who knowingly and wilfully makes any misrepresentation or false statement as to his age, and by reason of such misrepresentation or false statement obtains any spirituous or fermented liquors from any other person licensed to sell such spirituous or fermented liquors under the laws of this State, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than one dollar nor more than twenty dollars, or imprisoned in jail for not less than five days nor more than thirty days, or both fined and imprisoned in the discretion of the court; provided, that the testimony given by any minor or person under twenty-one years of age in the prosecution of any person for selling liquors to minors under the laws of this State shall not be used against such minor in prosecution under this act.

Misdemeanor. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That any person who obtains any spirituous or fermented liquors from any other person licensed to sell the same for any minor or person under twenty-one years of age, knowing him to be such, to be drunk by said minor or person under twenty-one years of age shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than
