

give away in such room or on or about the premises of such vendor any spirituous or fermented liquors whatsoever between the hours aforesaid.

SEC. 421. Any person violating any of the provisions of the preceding section, shall upon indictment and conviction thereof be fined not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, or be imprisoned in the county jail not less than thirty nor more than ninety days.

Penalty

SEC. 422. Any vendor of spirituous or fermented liquors sold in Cecil county, shall be liable to pay damages to any husband, wife, parents, child, employer or other person, injured by reason of any person being intoxicated by liquor sold by said vendor in violation of any of the provisions of this act, to be recovered in the same manner as debts for like amounts are now recovered by law.

Damages

SEC. 422 A. The provisions of this act shall not apply to sales by the manufacturer of cider in quantities not less than a quart which is not drunk on the premises of the manufacturer, nor to sales of spirituous or fermented liquors by the manufacturer thereof to any person licensed to sell spirituous or fermented liquor in Cecil county.

Older

SEC. 423. Nothing in the preceding sections shall be construed to authorize any sale or barter or the giving away of any spirituous or fermented liquors on the Sabbath day, commonly called "Sunday," or on the day of any election held in said county under the constitution and laws of the State or of the United States.

Sunday

SEC. 424. In any prosecution under this act it shall only be necessary to state that the traverser did sell or give away spirituous or fermented liquor without specifying the particular kind of liquor given away.

Need not specify

SEC. 425. One-half of all fines imposed under this act shall be paid to the county commissioners of said county for the use of said county.

Fines.

SEC. 426. All prosecutions for violation of any of the provisions of this act shall be upon presentment and indictment, and it shall be the duty of any justice of the peace of Cecil county upon information received and confirmed by the oath of a credible witness, to have any person arrested and committed to the county jail for a violation of the provisions of this act, unless such person shall give sufficient bail or recognizance with sureties to appear before the circuit court for Cecil county at the next succeeding term thereof to answer the charge.

Proceedings.

SEC. 427. No license shall be granted under the provisions of this act to any person other than a *bona fide* citizen of Cecil county, and who shall have been such for at least one year prior to the date of his application.
