

CHAPTER 476.

AN ACT for the better protection of fish, crabs, oysters and terrapins in the waters of Talbot county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That it shall not be lawful for any one but citizens and residents of Talbot county, at any time to take or catch fish in the waters of Talbot county. Unlawful.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That it shall not be lawful for any one but citizens and residents of Talbot county to take or catch crabs, oysters and terrapins in the tributaries of the Choptank river lying solely in Talbot county between Chancellor's point and Oxford. Unlawful.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That it shall not be lawful for the citizens and residents of Talbot county, or for any one else, at any time to take or catch fish with haul seines at any time in the tributaries of the Choptank river lying solely in Talbot county between Chancellor's point and Oxford. Unlawful.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That any person violating any of the provisions of this act shall upon conviction thereof before any justice of the peace of Talbot county, for each and every offense be fined the sum of twenty-five dollars, and stand committed to the county jail until fine and costs are paid. Penalty

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.

CHAPTER 477.

AN ACT to repeal section thirteen, of article fifty-six, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Licenses," sub-title "Brokers," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That section thirteen, of article fifty-six, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Licenses," sub-title "Brokers," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows: Repeal

SEC. 13. Any person applying for the same, and paying the sum of twenty-five dollars, may obtain a license for carrying on the business of real estate broker; this section not to apply to Baltimore city. Broker's license.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the first day of May, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety. Effective.
