### CHAPTER 480.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Takoma park, Montgomery and Prince George's counties.

- Style.** SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the inhabitants of the town of Takoma park, Montgomery and Prince George's counties, shall be and are hereby made a body corporate by the name and style of "The mayor and council of Takoma park," and by that name shall have perpetual succession, sue and be sued, and have and use a common seal.

- Limits.** SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the limits of said town shall be as follows: beginning at the intersection of the third line of the District of Columbia with the Metropolitan branch of the Baltimore and Ohio railroad, and running with the east side of said railroad to the northwest corner of Lewis and Heaton's subdivision; then with the outlines of said division to the north line of old "Takoma;" then with said line to Holt's west line; then with the lines of Holt, Carroll and Brasheares to the land purchased by Gilbert from Blair; then with the outlines of said land to the Sand spring road; then with said road to the road leading to Bladensburg; then with said Bladensburg road to the land of Jackson; then with the lands of Jackson and Riggs to the south lines of the aforesaid park; then with said lines to the aforesaid third line of the District of Columbia; then with said line reversed to the place of beginning.

- Mayor.** SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the citizens of said town having the qualifications prescribed for voters by the laws of this State, and having resided in said town for three months previous to any election, shall on the first Monday in May next, and every two years thereafter on the same day, at such place as shall be designated by the council between the hours of six a. m. and six p. m. elect one person, at least thirty years of age, mayor of said town, and four persons, not less than twenty-five years of age, who, together with the mayor, shall constitute the council; all of
