### CHAPTER 68.

AN ACT to increase the capital stock of the Loudon county and Frederick bridge company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That so much of section one, of chapter two hundred and twenty-six, of the act of eighteen hundred and eighty-eight, entitled "an act to incorporate the Loudon county and Frederick bridge company for a purpose of erecting a bridge at the Point of Rocks in Frederick county, Maryland, across the Potomac river, as limits the capital stock of said company to thirty-five thousand dollars, be and the same is hereby repealed. Repeal.

SEC. 2. *Be it enacted*, That the directors of the Loudon county and Frederick bridge company, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to increase the capital stock of said company so that the entire capital stock of said company shall not amount to more than the sum of forty-five thousand dollars, which stock shall be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each, and which stock shall have and possess the same rights, powers and privileges as pertained to the original stock of said company. May increase.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.

### CHAPTER 69.

AN ACT to authorize Henry W. Anderson, of Wicomico county, to settle his accounts as guardian to Paul Anderson, and to pay over all money due said ward.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Henry W. Anderson, guardian to Paul Anderson, a minor, be and he is hereby authorized to pass his final account as guardian before the orphans' court of Wicomico county, and to pay and deliver over to the said Paul Anderson all his property, real and personal and moneys that may be due to him on his final account when notified by the orphans' court of Wicomico county and take his receipt for the same, which shall be acknowledged. To empower.
