CHAPTER 485.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact chapter one hundred and fiftytwo, of the acts passed at the January session eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, entitled an act to repeal chapter four hundred and twenty-nine, of the acts passed at January session eighteen hundred and seventy-four, entitled an act to incorporate a company to construct a turnpike road from Hagerstown, in Washington county, to the town of Sharpsburg, passed at the January session eighteen hundred and fifty-three, chapter one hundred and twenty-nine, and to re-enact the said section with amendments.

Repeal.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That chapter one hundred and fifty-two, of the acts of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, of the General Assembly of Maryland. passed at the January session of the General Assembly of Maryland in the year eighteen hundred and seventy-eight, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Hagerstown and Sharpsburg turnpike company to continue upon their Toll-gate road, the toll-gate now erected on said road north of the point where the road known as the "Manor road" joins with the road of the Hagerstown and Sharpsburg turnpike company, and they shall not re-establish any other toll-gate upon said road north of the point of junction of the said turnpike road with the road known as the "College road."

Toll.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That the said Hagerstown and Sharpsburg turnpike company shall not charge at the said toll-gate now erected north of said manor road more than one-tenth of the toll authorized by original act of incorporation of said company upon all travel through said toll-gate which turns upon the said manor road or comes from the said manor road, except that for any such travel passing through said toll-gate, but once on any day it shall be lawful for said turnpike company to charge at least one cent.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from Effective the date of its passage, and the legislature hereby reserves to itself the right to alter, amend, annul or repeal this act at its pleasure.
