the several sections of this article of the Code of Public Local Laws, numbered from two hundred and seventy-nine to three hundred and fifteen inclusive, and the penalties thereby imposed for violating the same, except in so far as the provisions of said several sections as modified and changed by the two following sections of this act.

- 317. Sink-boxes alone shall be licensed for gunning in the Sink boxes waters described in the preceding section.
- 318. The hour before which on gunning days, all persons holding licenses to gun shall be prohibited from going with sink-boxes Hours. on or over the waters described in section three hundred and sixteen, shall be four o'clock instead of five o'clock.
- SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this act shall take effect Effective. from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 491.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That an additional section be and the same is hereby enacted and To add. added to article eighty-one, of the Code of Public General Laws of this State, entitled "Revenue and Taxes," sub-title "Payment of taxes by corporations," to be designated as "Section eighty-six A," relating to the taxation of savings banks and institutions, to read as follows:

SEC. 86 A. Nothing in section eighty-six, of this article, relating to savings banks, or savings institutions or corporations, No exempshall be construed as granting exemption from taxation to the
