CHAPTER 508.

AN ACT to require the county commissioners of Carroll county to pay to the mayor and common council of Westminster, one-half the amount of road tax levied or taxed upon the property within the limits of the city of Westminster.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall be the duty of the county commissioners of Carroll county to pay annually to the mayor and common council of Westminster, one-half of the amount of taxes levied and collected annually by said county commissioners for road purposes, upon the assessable property liable to taxation within the limits of the city of Westminster, to be appropriated and used by the said mayor and common council of Westminster, for the repair, maintenance and improvement of the streets and roads within the limits of said city.

Road tax.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from Effective. the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 509.

AN ACT to repeal, re-enact and amend section three hundred and seventy-eight, of article four, Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Health," so as to read as follows:

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section three hundred and seventy-eight, of article four, Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "City of Baltimore," subtitle "Health," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments so as to read as follows:

Repeal.

SEC. 378. The mayor and city council of Baltimore shall have power to pass ordinances to preserve the health of the city, to prevent and remove nuisances, and to prevent the introduction of Nuisances contagious diseases within the city and within three miles of the same upon land and within fifteen miles thereof upon the navigable waters leading thereto, and may regulate the places for manufacturing soap and candles, the erecting of slaughter houses and distilleries and where every other offensive trade may be carried on.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from Effective. the date of its passage.
