

Minors. permit minors to enter the bar room or other place where liquor is sold, unless said minor is accompanied by the parent or guardian of such minor; nor shall any person obtaining a license under this act, his agents, servants or employees, sell directly or indirectly, or give away at his, their or its place of business, any spirituous or fermented liquors, alcoholic bitters or intoxicating drinks of any kind whatsoever to any minor, or to any person known to such vendor to be purchasing or receiving such liquors or intoxicating drinks as the agent of, or on behalf of, or at the request of any minor.

Indictment. 151 F. Any person who shall violate the provision of the preceding section shall upon indictment and conviction thereof, be fined not less than fifty dollars nor more than five hundred dollars or be imprisoned in the county jail for not less than thirty days nor more than six months, and the license of such person may be suppressed in the discretion of the court.

Not sell to intoxicated persons. 151 G. No vendor of spirituous or fermented liquors licensed under this act, shall sell directly or indirectly any spirituous or fermented liquor to any person intoxicated at the time, nor shall it be lawful for any such licensed vendor to keep open the room where spirituous or fermented liquors are sold, between the hours of twelve o'clock at night and six o'clock in the morning, nor to sell directly or indirectly, or give away in such room, or on or about the premises of such vendor any spirituous or fermented liquor whatsoever, between the hours aforesaid.

Penalty. 151 H. Any person violating the provisions of the preceding section shall, upon indictment and conviction thereof, be fined not less than twenty-five, nor more than three hundred dollars, or be imprisoned in the county jail not less than thirty, nor more than ninety days, at the discretion of the court.

Unlawful. 151 I. Whenever any license shall be suppressed for any violation of this act, it shall not be lawful for the clerk of the circuit court for Kent county at any time, to grant another license under this act to the person whose license has been suppressed, nor to grant a license to any other person to sell spirituous or fermented liquors upon the premises covered by the license suppressed, for the term of twelve months from the date of such suppression.

Fraudulently procure. 151 K. Any person who shall fraudulently procure a license as a hotel keeper, without having complied in good faith with the provisions of this act, defining hotel keepers, shall, upon indictment and conviction thereof, be fined not less than two hundred, nor more than five hundred dollars; the license granted shall be suppressed by the court, and it shall be unlawful for the clerk to issue any other license for the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors to such person.
