

CHAPTER 520.

AN ACT to refund to Charles R. Wooters, late collector of State taxes for Talbot county, certain sums of money erroneously paid by him into the treasury.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the comptroller of the treasury be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant upon the treasurer of this State in favor of Charles R. Wooters, late collector of State taxes for Talbot county, in the sum of one hundred and twenty-seven dollars and ninety-four cents, being the amount over-paid by him into the treasury for the years eighteen hundred and eighty-four and eighteen hundred and eighty-five, the same having received the recommendation of the treasury officials. To repay.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.

CHAPTER 522.

AN ACT to incorporate the Hemsley's creek oyster planting company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That William E. Lowe, James H. Caulk, Frank G. Wrightson, Joshua G. Wrightson and James Seth, their associates and successors, be and they are hereby constituted and made a body corporate under and by the name of the Hemsley's creek oyster planting company, and by said name shall have perpetual succession and may by said name sue and be sued, and may have and use a common seal and the same may alter and renew at pleasure, and also to ordain, establish and put in execution such by-laws and regulations as shall seem necessary for the government and management of said corporation, and to alter and repeal the same at pleasure, and shall have and exercise all the rights, powers and privileges which corporate bodies may lawfully possess for the purposes mentioned in this act. Body corporate.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the purposes of said corporation shall be the propagation, planting, cultivating and farming of oysters in the waters of Talbot county only, in this State, but shall only extend to such coves, inlets and creeks as shall be less than one hundred yards in width at their mouth. Object.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the capital stock of such corporation shall be ten thousand dollars, to be divided into one thousand shares of the value of ten dollars each, and as soon as Capital stock.
