

sale shall be divided and paid to the State of Maryland, the city of Baltimore and to the citizens of Maryland and of the United States who have heretofore contributed, or may hereafter contribute to the purchase of land for said association or improving the same, or for other uses of said association, in the proportions to the amounts which they shall have severally contributed.

Repealed. SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That all parts of the acts to which this is an amendment inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Effective. SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 74.

AN ACT providing for heating, lighting and making other improvements in the Maryland penitentiary.

Steam heating. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the board of directors of the Maryland penitentiary, be and is hereby authorized and empowered to purchase and have erected in said penitentiary boilers for the purpose of heating said institution with steam, also to purchase and to place in said penitentiary electric light plant for the purpose of lighting said institution with electricity, and to make such other improvements as said board of directors may deem necessary.

Appropriation. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the sum of eighteen thousand dollars (\$18,000,) be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated to carry out the purpose of this act, and the comptroller is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the treasury payable to the order of said board of directors for such sums and at such times as shall be required by the said board of directors for purpose aforesaid; provided the aggregate of the sums so drawn shall not exceed the sum of eighteen thousand dollars.

Effective. SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
