

SEC. 35. No person shall shoot, or any manner catch, kill or have in possession, any partridge between the first day of February, said day included, and the first day of November next ensuing, in each and every year; nor any wood cock, between the first day of February and the fifteenth day of June; nor any rabbit ^{Game.} between the fifteenth day of January and the twentieth day of October; nor shall any person trap, destroy or molest the eggs or nests of any of the said birds at any time.

CHAPTER 532.

AN ACT to repeal sections two hundred and sixty and two hundred and sixty-one, of article two, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Anne Arundel county," sub-title "Wild Fowl," and re-enact the same with amendments.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That sections two hundred and sixty and two hundred and sixty-one, of article two, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Anne Arundel county," sub-title "Wild Fowl," be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments, so as to read as follows: ^{Repeal.}

SEC. 260. It shall not be lawful for any person to shoot at or shoot any duck or other wild fowl on or over the waters of West or Rhode rivers and their creeks, except from the natural shores of said rivers and their creeks, or from blinds placed in said waters within twenty-five yards from low water mark on the main lands bordering on said waters, which said blinds shall not be within three hundred yards of each other. ^{Wild fowl.}

SEC. 261. It shall not be lawful for any person to shoot at or shoot any duck or other wild fowl on or over the said West and Rhode rivers and their creeks, except on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays of each week; and it shall not be lawful for any person to put out decoy ducks within three hundred yards of any blind and shoot over the same. ^{Days.}

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. ^{Effective.}
