

spicuously posted on the property assessed within thirty days after the receipt of the same; and the constable receiving such tax-bills shall endorse-upon one copy thereof the time and manner of service made, and shall return the same to the treasurer within twenty days after making such service, the said constable shall be paid a fee of twenty-five cents for each tax-bill and notice served by them respectively, payable by the treasurer out of the additional charge of twenty-five cents aforesaid; and the constable shall have no authority to collect such bills, nor any part thereof; and any constable who shall do so, or who shall make any false return under the provisions of this section, shall be liable to indictment therefor, and upon conviction he shall pay a fine of fifty dollars, one-half thereof to go to the informer and the other half to the county school fund, for each such offense.

SEC. 235. The said treasurer shall be entitled to receive as full compensation for his services as collector of all county and school taxes an annual salary of twelve hundred dollars for and during his term of office, and until his successor shall have been duly elected and qualified; and no extra compensation whatever shall be allowed him or claimed by him, except such costs as are hereinbefore specified, or such as may accrue in the enforcement of the payment of taxes and for assessing new property; and he shall not be allowed to receive either directly or indirectly, any other commission or fee from any tax-payer, nor any levy fee other than the percentage provided for in section two hundred and thirty-two, nor shall he be allowed or claim any fee, compensation or remuneration for posting notices or for auctioneers' fees, or for reporting sales to the court, or for any appearance fees, attorneys fees or counsel fees in said court in connection with any such report of sales or otherwise in the discharge of the duties of his said office, nor shall he retain or demand out the proceeds of any sale made by him as treasurer any fees except such as are hereinbefore provided, and the fees allowed by law to the clerk of the circuit court in such cases, and if the treasurer or any clerk, agent or deputy of such treasurer shall ask, demand or receive any greater costs or fees than are allowed by the provisions of this and the preceding sections, the person so offending shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon indictment and conviction thereof, shall pay a fine of not less than one hundred dollars, nor more than five hundred dollars for each and every such offense, one-half thereof to go to the informer and the other to go to the school fund of said county; and the said commissioners shall allow the treasurer for the salary of a clerk or deputy an additional sum of money not to exceed six hundred dollars per annum; and the said commissioners are authorized and directed in their several annual levies to levy an amount sufficient to pay the salaries and fees so allowed; the said salaries and fees so allowed shall not be retained by the treasurer out of
