issued under the act of the General Assembly, eighteen hundred and seventy, chapter two hundred and forty-one, and maturing on the first day of June, eighteen hundred and ninety.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That the said mayor and city council of Cumberland shall levy on the taxable property of said city a sum of money each and every year sufficient to pay five thousand dollars of said bonds and the coupons on the bonds issued under and by virtue of this act as said bonds and coupons mature and become due.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from Effective. the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 81.

AN ACT to pay J. H. Medairy and Company a sum of money due them for supplies furnished by them to State tobacco warehouse number two, and for accounts assigned to them (for valuable consideration) for supplies furnished to said warehouse number two.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the comptroller of the treasury be, and he is hereby directed to draw his warrant on the treasurer in favor of J. H. Medairy and Company for the sum of fifty-seven dollars and seventy-five To appro- cents, being the amount certified to be due them by the inspector of State tobacco warehouse number two on account of supplies furnished by them and on account of supplies furnished by S. F. Sharretts to said warehouse number two assigned for valuable consideration by said Sharretts to said J. H. Medairy and Company, said supplies having been furnished to said warehouse house during the year eighteen hundred and eighty-eight.

AN ACT to provide for an additional justice of the peace in election district number five in Harford county.
