Sec. 23. The fine accruing under any of sections one to fortyone, of this article, shall be paid by the sheriff, constables or officers of the State fishery force collecting the same within ten days, to the county commissioners of the particular county where such fine may accrue, or to the mayor and city council of the city of Baltimore, if such fine shall accrue in said city, and it shall be the duty of the State's attorney for the several counties and for the city of Baltimore to keep an account of said fines imposed, and to make a monthly report thereof to the county commissioners of their respective counties, or to said mayor and city council as the case may be, and to see that said fines are duly collected and paid over as aforesaid; and the surplus after paying all costs for prosecution in such cases shall be paid to the State.

CHAPTER 566.

AN ACT to repeal sections forty-two to sixty-one, both inclusive, of article twelve, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Garrett county," sub-title "County Treasurer," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That sections forty-two to sixty-one, both inclusive, of article twelve, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Garrett county," sub-title "County Treasurer," be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments.

42. The county commissioners of Garrett county, on the third Tuesday in April, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety or as soon as may be thereafter, shall elect a competent person of sound judgment and skill as an accountant, county treasurer for said Treasurer. county, who shall give bond and qualify as hereinafter directed, and shall hold his office for two years from said third Tuesday in April or until his successor is elected and qualified.

42 A. The said treasurer shall be subject to removal from office by the county commissioners of said county at all times for wil-subject to ful neglect of duty or misdemeanor or misbehavior in office, upon presentment, indictment and conviction in a court of law.

42 B. The said county treasurer shall be the collector of all State and county taxes for whatsoever purpose levied, or to be levied for, or within said county during his term of office, or that may be placed in his hands for collection; and he shall have full power, and it shall be his duty to receive and collect all State and
