

or other place in which only fermented liquor or liquors containing less than fifteen per cent. of alcohol are sold, the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, and on the applicant's producing to the said mayor, counsellor and aldermen the receipt or a certificate of said collector and treasurer, showing the payment by the applicant of the fee for the class of business for which said mayor, counsellor and aldermen has decided to grant him, her or them a license, said mayor, counsellor and aldermen shall issue such license; and the license when issued shall designate the class or character of business for which the license is issued, and any person obtaining a license of the latter class who shall sell distilled liquors or any mixture thereof, or any liquors containing more than fifteen per cent. of alcohol, shall be liable to the same penalties as if the sale had been made without any license at all; provided, that any *bona fide* retail grocer doing business within said city who shall make application for a license to sell wines or other liquors in unbroken packages, or in quantities not less than one quart, and in no case to be drunk on the premises, may be licensed by said mayor, counsellor and aldermen to do so on complying with the conditions of this sub-title, and paying therefor the sum of one hundred dollars a year.

184 K. Out of the moneys received on application for license all expense of publication shall be paid, and out of the money paid for licenses all other expenses incident to the execution of the provisions of this sub-title relating to licenses in said city shall be paid, and one-fourth of the balance shall be paid over by the said collector and treasurer quarterly to the State of Maryland, and the remainder be applied to the general uses of the treasury of the said city of Annapolis.

Moneys received.

184 L. Every person in said city receiving a license under this sub-title, shall frame his license under a glass and place the same so that it shall at all times be conspicuous and easily read, in his chief place of making his sales, and no license issued in said city under this sub-title shall authorize sales by any person who shall neglect this requirement.

License to be framed

184 M. No licensee in said city under the provisions of this sub-title, shall sell or furnish any intoxicating liquors at any time to a drunkard, or to any person whose parent, guardian, husband, wife or child shall have given to such licensee a notice in writing verified by affidavit, that such person is of intemperate habits, and requesting such licensee not to sell to him or her, nor shall any licensee in said city under the provisions of this sub-title sell or furnish any intoxicating liquors at any time to a person at such times visibly affected by intoxicating drinks.

184 N. No licensee in said city under this sub-title shall sell or furnish to any person intoxicating liquors on any day upon which elections are now or hereafter may be required by law to be
