

tices of the peace and four constables; for election district number four, four justices of the peace and two constables; for election district number five, four justices of the peace and two constables; for election district number six, four justices of the peace and two constables; for election district number seven, three justices of the peace and two constables; for election district number eight, four justices of the peace and two constables; for election district number nine, ten justices of the peace and six constables; two of said constables shall be for the third election precinct in said ninth district, and one of them shall be appointed from and for the village of Towson, and shall be also a special officer of said village and shall be required to uniform himself, and shall also act as night officer, going on duty at eleven o'clock, p. m., and remaining until five o'clock, a. m.; the pay of such special officer shall be twenty-five dollars per month, and such fees as he may earn in the discharge of his duties as constable; for election district number ten, three justices of the peace and one constable; for election district number eleven, seven justices of the peace and two constables; for election district number twelve, nine justices of the peace and four constables; for election district number thirteen, three justices of the peace and three constables.

## CHAPTER 95.

AN ACT to repeal section thirty-five, of article twenty-six, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Courts," sub-title "Court of Appeals," relating to the compensation of the crier of the court of appeals and the sheriff appointed to attend said court, and to re-enact the same with amendments, defining the duties and fixing the salary of the crier of said court of appeals and the compensation of the sheriff appointed to attend said court.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That section thirty-five, of article twenty-six, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Courts," sub-title "Court of Appeals," relating to the compensation of the crier of the court of appeals and of the sheriff appointed to attend said court, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Repeal.

35. It shall be the duty of any crier appointed by the court of appeals to be in attendance at the rooms of said court every day in the year, legal holidays and Sundays excepted; and he shall receive for his services one thousand dollars per annum, payable in quarterly instalments; and whenever in the judgment of said
