

CHAPTER 98.

AN ACT to punish false accusations and threats.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That any person who with intent to extort money or procure other profit, shall falsely accuse or threaten to accuse another of any crime, or of anything which if the accusation were true would tend to bring him into contempt or disrepute, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by imprisonment in jail or the house of correction not exceeding two years. Misdemeanor.

CHAPTER 99.

AN ACT to prevent the destruction of fish by the use of dynamite or other explosives in the waters and streams of Frederick county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That any person who shall destroy or attempt to destroy any fish by dynamite or other explosives in any of the waters or streams of Frederick county shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction before any tribunal having jurisdiction in the premises shall be fined not less than twenty-five nor more than one hundred dollars for each offense, one half to the informer and the other half to the board of county school commissioners of Frederick county. Misdemeanor.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.

CHAPTER 100.

AN ACT to authorize the mayor and city council of Baltimore to license and regulate the sale of fresh fruits, vegetables and other perishable articles in the streets of Baltimore city.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the mayor and city council of Baltimore be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to license and regulate the sale of fresh fruits, vegetables and other perishable articles in the streets of Baltimore city. To regulate.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.
