

from all itinerant players or showmen exhibiting within said town but shall not accept tickets to any such entertainment as payment therefor; shall also have power to regulate, restrain or prohibit any theatrical or other public exhibition on the streets, or indoors within said town, when the same shall be deemed demoralizing or otherwise obnoxious or objectionable; to license saloons, breweries and other places where malt, spirituous, vinous or fermented liquors are sold; provided, that no greater sum than thirty dollars be charged for any one license for any of the foregoing objects.

SEC. 413. All ordinances passed in pursuance of the above sections shall be printed and posted in the most public places in the said town, and also recorded in a book for that purpose by the clerk, and which book shall be in the keeping of the burgess and open at all times to the inspection of all persons interested. SEC. 414. All ordinances heretofore passed by the burgess and commissioners of Williamsport and now in force and not in conflict with the provisions of this act, are hereby continued in force until the same are repealed or modified. To con-

SEC. 415. If it be necessary to go outside of the ordinary taxes levied for town purposes as prescribed elsewhere, for the establishment of a fire department or the erection and maintenance of a lock-up as herein authorized, the burgess and commissioners are hereby empowered to levy a special or additional tax therefor; provided, any ordinance so providing shall be first submitted to the voters at the next ensuing election for municipal officers for ratification thereof; if two-thirds of the votes be cast in favor the same shall stand, if not, shall be of non effect. Special tax

SEC. 416. The said burgess and commissioners may appoint a collector of taxes for the said town, who shall have the same power to distrain and sell as collectors of county taxes have, and shall receive such compensation for his services as the said corporation may deem just; he shall give bond with approved security to the said corporation for the prompt and faithful discharge of his duties. Collector.

SEC. 417. The said burgess and commissioners may annually lay an equal tax on all the real and personal property within the limits of said town, which is legitimately subject to taxation by the county and State for the general uses of the said corporation, not to exceed in amount thirty cents on each hundred dollars worth of taxable property, two-thirds at least of such amount so collected to be used exclusively for the repairs and improvement of the streets and alleys of the said town, as the board may deem necessary from year to year to be done, and should it become necessary in the future to meet condemnations of property, or for opening up of new streets and alleys and placing the same in good passable condition, or for grading or macadamizing, or otherwise Taxation.
