than fifteen days before the same there shall be drawn from the names remaining in the box from which the jury from the preceding August term was drawn twenty-five names, which shall constitute the petit jurors for said December term, subject to the provisions and regulations applicable to the correction and completion of the jurors drawn for the other jury terms aforesaid.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted. That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 6.

AN ACT for the better protection of the morals and health of minors.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That no person engaged in performing upon any musical instrument in, upon or near to any street, lane, alley or highway, or engaged in selling, vending or disposing of any goods, wares or merchandise in, upon or near to any street, lane, alley or highway, or engaged in any business, occupation or calling in, upon or near to any street, lane, alley or highway, and not having a fixed store, shop or place of business at which so engaged, shall have in his possession or company while so engaged, any boy or girl under the age of eight years; and any person violating the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine not exceeding ten dollars for each and every such offense.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 7.

AN ACT to authorize the county commissioners of Charles county to appropriate a sufficient sum of money to pay the balance due on expenditures for public road purposes for the calendar year eighteen hundred and eighty-nine.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the county commissioners of Charles county be and they are hereby directed and ordered to levy upon the taxable property of said county or to pay out of any funds they may have on hand not otherwise appropriated, a sufficient sum to pay the amount
