

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That the said corporation may increase its capital stock one thousand shares, provided at least two-thirds of all the stock of said corporation be voted in favor of such increase, at a meeting of the stockholders called for the purpose of considering and determining upon such increase. Increased stock.

SEC. 4. *And be it further enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.

CHAPTER 111.

AN ACT to add an additional section to article eleven, of the Code of Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland, entitled "Frederick county," sub-title "Frederick," to be known as "Section one hundred and seventy A," to prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors in Frederick on the days of municipal elections therein.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the following section be added to article eleven, of the Code of Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland, entitled "Frederick county," sub-title "Frederick," to follow section one hundred and seventy, and to be known as "Section one hundred and seventy A," to read as follows: To add a section.

170 A. It shall not be lawful for the keeper of any hotel, tavern, store, drinking establishment, or any place where liquors are sold within the taxable limits of Frederick, or for any person or persons directly or indirectly within said taxable limits to sell, barter, or give or dispose of any spirituous or fermented liquors, ale or beer or intoxicating drinks of any kind on the day of any election hereafter to be held in said city of Frederick, and any person violating the provisions of this section shall be liable to indictment by the grand jury of Frederick county, and upon conviction shall be fined a sum not less than fifty dollars nor more than two hundred dollars in the discretion of the court for each and every offense; one-half of the fine shall be paid to the informer and the other half to the city register of Frederick city for the use of the city, and upon failure to pay such fine the person so convicted shall be committed to the jail of Frederick county and confined therein until such fine and costs are paid. Unlawful.
