CHAPTER 64.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments section one and to repeal section eleven of chapter 183 of the Laws of Maryland, passed at the session of 1890, entitled "An act to create a treasurer for Calvert County and to provide for the collection of taxes therein.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section one of chapter 183 of the acts of Repealed 1890, entitled "an act to create a treasurer for Calvert County and Re-enacted and to provide for the collection of taxes therein," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted to read as follows:

SEC. 2. That the Governor of the State of Maryland, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate shall, biennially, appoint a competent person, resident of Calvert Treasurer for County, treasurer for said county, who shall give bond and calvert qualify as hereinafter directed, and who shall be ineligible for re-appointment until one full term has elapsed, and who shall hold his office for two years and until his successor is appointed and qualified, as hereafter provided, and who shall be subject at all times to be removed by the Governor for wilful neglect of duty or misdemeanor in office, upon conviction in a court of law; the said treasurer shall be collector of all State and County taxes for whatever purpose or purposes levied or to be levied for or within said county during the term of his office, or that may be placed in his hands for collection; and he shall have full power and it shall be his duty to receive and collect all State and county taxes levied as aforesaid and so put in his hands for collection, and all moneys which may be due said county, with full power to enforce the payment of the same by sale or otherwise, and to convey title to any real or personal estate sold by him; and when it shall be necessary for him to proceed to collect the taxes paid in his hands by sale of To collect real or personal property, he shall proceed, as now directed, for the collection of taxes, by collecting, and shall be allowed the same fees therefor as now allowed collectors, except that a notice of unpaid taxes by a constable or constables, as hereinafter provided, shall be deemed a sufficient notice prior to making the levy.

SEC. 3. And be it further enacted, That section eleven be Repeal. and the same is hereby repealed.

SEC. 4. And be it further enacted, That this act shall take effect on the first day of Jahuary, in the year eighteen hun. In force. dred and ninety-four.
