

of the point where the road known as the College road joins with the road of the Hagerstown and Sharpsburg Turnpike Company, and they shall be authorized to charge at said gate the tolls now authorized to be charged by their original act of incorporation.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That before the said Hagerstown and Sharpsburg Turnpike Company shall have the right to erect said toll gate, and charge the tolls as authorized by section two of this act, they shall discontinue the toll gate now upon said road north of the point where the road known as the Manor road joins with the road of said company. Toll gate.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.

CHAPTER 99.

AN ACT to repeal section fifty one of article twenty-seven of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Crimes and Punishments" sub-title "Destroying Property Maliciously," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That section fifty-one of article twenty-seven of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Destroying Property Maliciously," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, so as to read as follows : Repealed.

SEC. 51. Any person who shall enter any dwelling-house, outhouse, stable, barn, warehouse, storehouse, banking-house, factory, workshop, court house, school house, mill house, church, or any building occupied in part or in whole by any of the public, municipal, or private corporations of the state, or upon any vessel, or upon any yard where lumber, coal, or any sort of goods and chattels are deposited or kept for the purpose of trade, or upon any property or land, with the intent maliciously to injure, or destroy any of the buildings aforesaid or any part thereof, or any furniture, property or effects therein or thereon being found, or any property or effects deposited or kept in, or upon any vessel or yard, or with the intent to slay, kill, maim or tar and feather any person being in, or upon any of the premises aforesaid, upon conviction thereof shall, in the discretion of the court be sentenced to the penitentiary of this Malicious Intent.
