

Board of Liquor License Commissioners for Baltimore City, who shall hold office for two years, and until their successors are appointed and qualified, and their duties shall be such as hereinafter prescribed. Provided, however, that the Liquor License Commissioners appointed in April, eighteen hundred and ninety, shall continue in office until the expiration of the term for which they were appointed.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 14.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments section six of article sixty-five of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Militia."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That section six of article sixty-five of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland be, and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments, so as to read as follows :

Repeal

6. The General Staff of the Militia shall consist of an Adjutant General, with the rank of Major General, and salary at the rate of fifteen hundred dollars a year, who shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, and hold office until the appointment and qualification of his successor, or until removed in pursuance of the sentence of a court martial, and such other officers not exceeding fifteen in number, as the Governor may deem requisite and necessary to appoint for the proper and efficient organization of the Militia of the State, and the discharge of his duties as Commander-in-Chief, in which number may be included a Quarter Master General, a Chief of Ordnance, an Inspector General, a Surgeon General, and a Judge Advocate General, each of whom shall have the rank of Brigadier General; and ten Aides-de-Camp with the rank of Colonel.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
