

pleasure of said town at any time after five years from their date, and said town shall have the like powers to levy a tax to pay said interest, and provide a sinking fund for the redemption of said bonds, as are given by said act, of 1890 in relation to the interest and principal of the bonds named therein.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the mayor and councilmen of Frostburg, at the next regular election of officers of said town, after the passage of this act shall submit to the qualified voters of said town the question whether or not said bonds shall be issued as hereinbefore directed, and at said election all voters desiring to vote on said question, shall cast a ballot upon which, in addition to the names of the candidates voted for, shall be written or printed the words "For the issue of bonds," or "Against the issue of bonds," as the voter shall desire, and if a majority of the votes cast at said election on this question shall be in favor of such issue of bonds the mayor and councilmen shall have power to issue said bonds (not exceeding \$15,000.00) on any part thereof and to sell or otherwise dispose of the same or any part thereof for the purpose of completing the construction and equipment of said water works, or to pay any debt said town may have then already incurred in and about the same, or to purchase any franchises or other water works, but if a majority of the votes cast, and said question shall be against the issue of said bonds, then such bonds shall not be issued, and in giving the usual notice of the time, place and object of said election it shall be the duty of said mayor and councilmen to give notice of the submission of said question to the voters and they shall cause section one and two of this act to be published in some newspaper printed in said town at least ten days before said election.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That on and after the first Monday in May, 1892, the said Frostburg Water Board, provided for in said act of Assembly of 1890 hereby amended, shall be abolished and cease to act, and at the annual election on the first Monday in April, 1892, no person shall be elected to serve as members of said board as provided in said act, but after the first Monday in May, 1892, all said water works, its reservoirs, pipe lines, hydrants, connections, and all property and business pertaining to said water works and the running, using and operating the same shall be controlled, cared for and managed by the mayor and councilmen of Frostburg as hereinafter provided.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That on and after the first Monday in May, 1892, the mayor of said town shall, in ad-
