

thereof or along its springs, streams or pipes; nor shall it be lawful for any person or persons to open any of the stops, valves, or tap any of the pipes to draw therefrom any water without the permission of the corporate authorities of Middletown first had and obtained, under such regulations and ordinance as they shall prescribe.

SEC. 7. *And be it enacted*, That it shall not be lawful for any person or persons habitually to loiter around the reservoir or grounds thereof for amusement, or to enter the enclosure of the reservoir without the permission of the corporate authorities of Middletown.

SEC. 8. *Be it enacted*, That upon information given upon oath or affirmation to the burgess or any justice of the peace of Frederick County, of any violation of any of the provisions of this act, such burgess or justice of the peace of Frederick County shall issue his warrant to be directed to the sheriff or any constable of said county for the arrest of the offender or offenders, and bring such offender or offenders before the said burgess or justice of the peace of said county, and upon conviction thereof, the said offender or offenders shall be fined not less than five nor more than one hundred dollars, together with the costs of the proceedings, to be taxed as costs in other criminal proceedings; one half of said fine to be paid to the informer, and the other half to the corporate authorities for the use of the water works, and in case of the non-payment of such fine and costs imposed by the burgess or justice of the peace, the said offender or offenders shall be committed to the county jail for a period not less than five, nor more than sixty days, or until such fine and costs are paid.

SEC. 9. *And be it enacted*, That in addition to the remedy and punishments provided for in section eight of this act, that the burgess and commissioners of Middletown, Frederick County, Maryland, be authorized and empowered, upon information or petitions filed in their corporate name in Frederick County, to apply to any judge of the Circuit Court for Frederick County in term time or vacation, for an injunction to restrain and prevent the nuisances and evils intended to be prevented by this act, no matter by whom or under what authority committed.
