move from the natural rocks in the waters of the Synipuxent Bay in Worcester County any oysters of a less size than two Removing and one half inches in length, and that any person upon sympusconviction of having removed such oysters of a less size ent hav than two and one half inches in length from said natural rocks, or of having such oysters of a less size than two and one half inches in length so removed from said natural rocks in said waters, in his possession, shall be fined not less than twenty-five dollars, nor more than one hundred dollars, or be sentenced to the county jail or the House of Correction for not less than one month, nor for more than six months; provided, however, that nothing in the act shall be construed as interfering with the taking of oysters of any size from Penalty. private beds.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That all fines recovered under this act shall go to the oyster planting fund for Worcester shall go. County.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted. That this act shall take effect Effective from the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 131.

AN ACT to incorporate the trustees of the McDonough school.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Samuel H. Tagart, William A. Stewart, David L. Bartlett, German H. Hunt, William Keyser, Enoch G. Hipsley, Julian Le Roy White, and their successors be and they are hereby declared to be a body corporate, by the Incorporate name and style of the trustees of the McDonough school, trustees of and by that name they and the and by that name, they and their successors, to be elected and appointed as hereinafter directed, shall and may, at all times hereafter be capable in law, to have, receive and retain, to them and their successors, property real and personal, and also to receive gifts, devises and bequests of any person or persons, bodies corporate and politic, capable of making the same, for the purpose of advancing the cause of education, founding chairs and scholarships and advancing mechanical and general knowledge, in the modes pointed out by the donors or testators, and invest the same and at their pleasure, to transfer and dispose of the same in such manner as they may think proper.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the number of trustees of the McDonough school shall not be less than seven nor more
