such appointment shall occur, if for any reason any person or persons drawn as a grand juror or grand jurors shall fail to attend and be present at the conclusion of the drawing or be disqualified or excused for cause, the court shall rill vacanforthwith proceed to fill such vacancy or vacancies from the aforesaid remaining number of twenty-five names of Jury, and those who are present in the order in which the names were in Petit drawn from the box, and may thereupon in its discretion fill such vacancy or vacancies thus made in the petit jury by drawing the necessary number of additional names there-for in manner provided by section eighty of this article fifty-one; this section not to apply to Prince George's County, except so far as it authorizes the court to appoint a foreman of the grand jury when the necessity for such appointment occurs.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this act shall Effective. take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 154.

AN ACT to repeal section one and two of the acts of eighteen hundred and seventy-four, chapter 282, entitled "An act for the relief of Washington College and to appropriate money for the same and provide for the education and board of one scholar from each county, of the Eastern Shore," and to re-enact said sections one and two so as to read as follows:

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That sections one and two of the acts of eighteen hundred and seventy-four, chapter two hundred and eighty- and re-en-actment two, entitled "An act for the relief of Washington College and to appropriate money for the same and provide for the education and board of one scholar from each county of the Eastern Shore," be and are hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

SEC. 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer on the warrant of the Comptroller, be and he is hereby authorized and directed in addition to the ation to sum now annually paid to the visitors and governors of Washington Washington College to pay to the said visitors and gover nors the further sum of three thousand dollars annually on and after the first day of June, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-two.
