

**Election valid** SEC. 2 A. *And be it further enacted*, That the election of the seven directors named in section one hereof and the previous elections of seven directors as aforesaid under said supposed authority be and the same are hereby declared valid as well as the acts done by them in pursuance of the provisions of said act.

**Shall apply** SEC. 2 B. *And be it enacted*, That the provisions and enactments set forth in sections three, four, five, six, seven, eight and nine of said act shall apply to the said corporation as hereby amended and to the land heretofore or which may hereafter be acquired by it.

**Acquisition of land.** SEC. 2 C. *And be it enacted*, That any acquisition of land beyond four acres heretofore made as aforesaid by said body corporate under supposed authority so to do, is hereby made valid as fully as though authority had been given therefor under the said act.

**Effective.** SEC. 2 D. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

### CHAPTER 163.

AN ACT to repeat and re-enact with amendments sections 206, 207, 220 and 237 of the Act of 1890, chapter 201, entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact certain sections of article 17, of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Prince George's County," sub-title "Laurel," and to add additional sections thereto.

**Repeal and re-enactment.** SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That sections two hundred and six, two hundred and seven, two hundred and twenty, two hundred and thirty-seven, of article seventeen of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Prince George's County," sub-title "Laurel," as repealed and re-enacted by the act of eighteen hundred and ninety, chapter two hundred and one, be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted to read as follows :

**Mayor shall appoint three assessors.** SEC. 206. There shall be appointed by the mayor and city council during the month of April, eighteen hundred and ninety-four, and every three years thereafter, three assessors, one from each ward, who shall possess the qualifications required by the mayor, who shall constitute a board of assessors, and whose duty it shall be after having qualified by taking an oath, to faithfully, honestly and
